IN MEMORIAM

Rita Smith, died early Saturday morning, July 1, 2017, in Melbourne, Florida. Rita was a member of 50 years of the LWV of NCC and a dedicated volunteer in the office for many years, as well as serving as treasurer for the Delaware Education Fund for years, and the state VOTER editor for untold years. I am grateful to her to have spent so many hours with Rita during the she spent in the office for her help and advice, and especially her humor. (Letty Diswood)

Her children shared these memories with her friends and family: "Although Mom's health crisis came unexpectedly, all three of us were able to spend time with her during her last hours. Up to the very end, she was the Rita we all cherish: alert, interested, funny, sweet, and tart. We miss her enormously, and we know you will, too."

"Mom was an extraordinary person. Born a country girl in the coal town of Herminie, Pennsylvania — where both of her grandfathers worked in the mines — she moved to the nearby factory town of Swissvale at age 9. Although her parents both left school after eighth grade, Rita graduated near the top of her high school class. In a time and place when college attendance was unusual for boys and rare for girls, she graduated with honors from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh. She was one of the few women in the math department and in the early days of mainframe computing, the field in which she worked at Westinghouse and DuPont.

"It would be hard to say which Mom loved more: numbers or words. (Her niece and goddaughter Paula points out a fitting numerical symmetry in the date of Rita's death: 7/1/17.) Equally at home with a crossword puzzle or a math problem; meticulous monitor of the family finances; scribbler of poems — often acrostics — for birthdays and Christmas gifts; improviser of vocal harmonies; occasional painter of murals, models, and, once, a lattice-top patio table (by hand — no spray paint for her!), Mom was both creative and analytical, relishing details while nourishing her soul with books, plays, movies, and the company of people she loved.

"Far more important than her many talents, skills, and accomplishments were Mom's personal relationships. From her days at St. Anselm School and Swissvale High, through the Smith family's decades in Wilmington, to the past eight years living at The Fountains in Melbourne, Rita was a loving, kind, generous, and sage friend and family member. The three of us cannot imagine better parents than her and Dad.

Although Mom's energy for correspondence and phone calls flagged in recent years, she was grateful for her connections to all of you — a gratitude that we share. Thank you for being there for our family for all these years. In love and sadness,

Delaware ERANow's Ready to Run@ Delaware program begins on October 11, 2017.

This program is an affiliate of the Center for American Women in Politics (CAWP) at Rutgers University. The kickoff session, featuring U.S. Representative Lisa Blunt Rochester's keynote address, begins on October 16th from 6:15 – 8:15 p.m. at the Delaware Law School.

It is apparent that, over the long run, women's equality will require that we have more seats at the table when decisions are made that affect us as well as our families. It follows, then, that we must make every effort to provide women with the confidence, skills and knowledge they need to run for public office, or become more involved in the political process by standing for appointment to boards and commissions, or becoming active in political parties.

Take the course yourself or forward this information to your friends and associates, encouraging them to take the course. The LWV of New Castle County has made a contribution to this program.

Representative Lisa Blunt Rochester has agreed to provide the keynote speech for Ready to Run® Delaware. The first session will be held from 6:15-8:15 pm October 16th with the second session occurring two evenings later on Wednesday the 18th. The four remaining sessions, all on Wednesday evenings from 6:15-8:15 pm, continue through November 15, 2017. In addition to Rep. Blunt Rochester, there will be a dynamic group of legislators, party officials, and campaign experts as presenters and look forward to a successful program.

Program partners are —the Delaware Commission for Women, Delaware Law School, and Mary Ann's List—as well as the Delaware Democratic Party and YWCA Delaware (sponsors). Scholarships are available. Registration fee is \$100.
